INVITATION FOR BID

Johnson County Animal Shelter Generator

Johnson County Fiscal Court (hereinafter, "County") is seeking sealed bids for the supply, delivery, and installation of a 50 kW, single-phase, 120/240 Volt, diesel powered, standby generator, and a 200 Amp Service Entrance Rated, 3-phase Automatic Transfer Switch with a NEMA3R enclosure, as well as annual generator maintenance services to be quoted as a separate line item.

This project will be partially funded through FEMA's 404 Hazard Mitigation Grant Program with the purpose of ensuring uninterrupted power supply during emergency situations, safeguarding the continuous operation of critical systems within the facility.

BID SUBMISSION

- Bid and all requested information and documentation shall be submitted <u>no later than Monday.</u>
 <u>March 10, 2025 at 3:00 PM EST</u> through the online DFS Procurement Portal (hereinafter, "Portal" or "DFS Portal") at <u>dfs.bonfirehub.com</u>.
- Bids received after the due date and time will be considered non-responsive and will not be considered.
- Questions regarding the scope or IFB should be submitted in the DFS Procurement Portal prior to March 6, 2025 at 5:00 PM. For questions regarding vendor registration or navigation in the portal, please email: procurement@erassist.com.
- Bids will be opened publicly at the Fiscal Court meeting on March 10, 2025 at 4:45 p.m. at the Johnson County Fiscal Court office located at 230 Court Street, Suite 201, Paintsville, KY 41240.
- Submission of any bid signifies the Contractor's agreement that their bid and the content
 thereof, are valid for ninety (90) calendar days following the submission deadline and will
 become part of the contract that is negotiated between the Johnson County Fiscal Court and the
 successful bidder. All prices submitted with the bid shall remain in effect for the ninety (90) day
 period.
- Costs of preparation of a response to this invitation for bid are solely those of the bidders. The County assumes no responsibility for any such costs incurred by the bidder. The bidder also

- agrees that the County bears no responsibility for any costs associated with any administrative or judicial proceedings resulting from the solicitation process.

 whose offer is most advantageous to the County and in the best interests of the County.
- Johnson County Fiscal Court is an Equal Opportunity Employer. All companies, including women, minority, and veteran owned businesses are encouraged to submit a bid.

GENERAL TERMS & INFORMATION

- The Johnson County Animal Shelter is located at 100 Shelter Way, Staffordsville, KY 41256.
 The GPS coordinates for the generator site are (37.795638, -82.907096)
- The Contractor's products shall be guaranteed to be free from defects in material and/or workmanship and to perform as advertised when properly used and maintained in accordance with written instructions. Goods and Services furnished, whether manufactured or fabricated by Vendor or a third party, shall (a) be new; (b) be first quality; (c) strictly conform to the specifications and samples; and (d) be free from defects in materials and workmanship. Vendor shall be required to promptly replace Goods and Services, after receiving notification from the County of defects or nonconformance. A one-year (365 days) unconditional warranty shall be in effect on materials and workmanship.
- The unit proposed must meet current Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") requirements for Federal Emission Regulation and comply with all applicable codes (local, state, federal), industry standards, laws, and regulations, including all applicable National Electrical Codes ("NEC") and National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") codes.

- Contractor shall be responsible for all expenses incurred while performing services under this Agreement. This includes automobile, truck, and other travel expenses; vehicle maintenance and repair costs; vehicle and other license fees and permits; insurance premiums; road, fuel, and other taxes; fines; radio, pager, or cell phone expenses; meals; and all salary, expenses, and other compensation paid to employees or contract personnel the Contractor hires to complete the work under this Agreement.
- Contractors will be responsible for determining all requirements and permits needed to complete the installation of the generator, transfer switch, any associated components needed to ensure the proper, efficient, and safe operation of the system. The awarded contractor will also be responsible for obtaining any and all engineering approvals mandated and required by federal, state, or local codes or regulations. All permits, inspections, engineering approvals and associated requirements are the responsibility of the selected Contractor. Copies of required permits and approvals must be provided to the County upon receipt.
- All equipment and components must be installed according to the manufacturer's instructions and in accordance with all local, state and federal codes and regulations.
- Installation of the unit shall be performed by licensed electricians and other certified installers. License and/or certification shall be provided to the County upon award.
- This project will be partially funded by FEMA's 404 Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. All work
 must comply with all applicable requirements and guidelines found in <u>FEMA Hazard Mitigation</u>
 <u>Assistance Program and Policy Guide FP-206-21-0001</u> and the <u>Hazard Mitigation Assistance</u>
 <u>Guidance Addendum, February 27, 2015.</u>
- Any contract resulting from this IFB will contain the required "FEMA clauses." These may be found on FEMA's website at the following link: <u>contract provisions template | fema</u>.
- Awarded contractor shall be required to document all work performed throughout this project to
 ensure compliance with grant requirements. Documentation shall accompany invoice
 submittal(s) and include <u>descriptions of all work performed and the date it occurred</u> as well as
 photos of the project site before, during, and after installation.
- Invoice(s) shall be itemized in order to comply with FEMA and KYEM grant reporting and reimbursement guidelines. Johnson County reserves the right to request additional information or documentation from the contractor in order to comply with grant guidelines or formal requests from FEMA or KYEM.
- Any temporary power disruptions or service disconnections necessary during the installation of the new system must be approved by and coordinated with the County. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure power is maintained at the facility throughout the performance of all work, unless it is deemed unnecessary by the County.
- Removal and proper disposal of all construction debris and materials resulting from the project are the responsibility of the contractor. All costs of disposal are the responsibility of the contractor. Costs in this bid are all-inclusive, including disposal transportation and tipping fees.

- If the scope of work of this project changes for any reason, work may be required to stop until additional approvals are obtained from FEMA. If circumstances requiring a scope change arise during the performance of the work, the County must be notified immediately and all work must stop until a notice to proceed is provided by the County.
- The scope of work involves ground disturbance (pad, trenching). Documentation for any and all ground disturbances must be submitted with invoice, to include <u>methods</u>, <u>dimensions</u>, <u>and</u> <u>photographs</u> (<u>before</u>, <u>during</u>, <u>and</u> <u>after</u>).
- If fill or rock is needed to fulfill the scope of work, the contractor must first identify the source and location of the material and provide this information to the County for approval. <u>Documentation of the source location</u> (physical address and GPS) and the quantity of fill or rock installed must be provided (documentation example types: quarry tickets, invoice, calculation sheet, or third party document).

SCOPE OF WORK

The work required for this project includes providing all components, materials, equipment, and labor needed to install a new automatic backup emergency generator system to fully power the Johnson County Animal Shelter facility, located at 100 Shelter Way, Staffordsville, KY 41256, during power outages as part of a project partially funded by FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. This includes any design, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical work needed to properly carry out the scope of work according to federal, state, and local codes and regulations. A fully functional "turn-key" system upon completion of work shall be provided.

The Bidder agrees to perform the following services:

- Supply one (1) new 50kW, 120/240V, single-phase generator and one (1) 200 amp, SER Automatic Transfer Switch that meet or exceed the specifications set forth in Appendix A of this IFB.
- Provide all components, materials, equipment, and labor for the installation of the generator and the automatic transfer switch.
 - If any existing items directly involved in this project are found to be in need of replacement,
 the County must be notified and approve the replacement of any existing components.
- Provide a new concrete generator pad. The concrete pad can be prefabricated or poured.
 - A poured pad shall be designed according to the specifications set forth in Appendix A of this IFB.
 - If a prefabricated pad is used, it must be designed for the generator model proposed.
- Make all necessary connections for a fully functioning system.
- Contractor shall provide initial start-up and field acceptance testing to meet NFPA 110 requirements with a county representative present.
 - The contractor will provide the report to the County after the conclusion of acceptance testing and start-up.
 - Any special equipment or coordination with outside entities required for testing and start-up is the responsibility of the contractor.
- The contractor will instruct select county personnel on all operations and safety features. At least two (2) on-site hours of training will be provided to the County employees by the contractor.
- Contractor will provide Johnson County with two (2) copies of all manuals and instructions.
- In addition to aforementioned underlined items, final deliverables also include:
 - Design plans/drawing/sketch of the system and all connections,
 - Manufacturer warranty documentation,
 - Complete & sign the Generator Sizing Confirmation Report. A sample for is provided as Appendix D for reference. Actual report will be provided in contract and must be signed by a licensed electrician.




